Seized Dogs Released for Adoption

An "Agreement of Forfeiture" has been entered in a Tulsa County court case which now allows 50 seized dogs to be adopted by the general public. The dogs were taken into custody as evidence in a 2007 Tulsa County animal cruelty case. Charges of cruelty to animals have been filed against Gordon and Helen Hall. The case is still on-going at this time.

Tulsa County Deputies responded to an alarm call on November 13, 2007, at a residence in north Tulsa County. Deputies found the dogs existing in deplorable conditions. The dogs were transported to the Tulsa Animal Shelter and have been held as evidence in the case.

The breeds of dogs available for adoption are Maltese, Schipperke, Miniature Schnauzer, Chihuahua, and Silky Terrier. To adopt one of these dogs, the general public should contact the Tulsa Animal Shelter for their regular adoption procedures.
